Dear Parish Family,

Mother knows best!

At Christmas time, I got to spend some time with my family. I watched my grandniece Adaline who has not long turned one, she was standing and holding on, smiling at everyone thinking she was so clever. At the same time, I watched her mother carefully guiding and encouraging her to make the next step, which she did. Of course, falling on her bottom from time to time.

Today we begin the season known as Ordinary Time. The colour is green to symbolise growth and life now extraordinary in light of the birth of Emmanuel – God with us. In today's Gospel, we have the wedding feast at Cana. Jesus is hesitant to open his Spirit-given gifts in public yet, it was his mother who saw an urgent need using her Spirit given gifts of insight and motherly care saying, yes, it is! Not directly but directly...do whatever he tells you. The miracle of turning water into wine in six stone jars. Did you know that a jar is equivalent to about a hundred of our current bottles of wine, that's a lot of wine (and a lot of headaches)? We are used to Jesus' healing miracles but this sets the scene for Jesus' ministry and our year. God's desires for us abundance but that abundance must be shared with others...just like the Spirit-given gifts we heard in the Second Reading. Jesus cares that we experience joy, friendship and love the fullness of life for which we were created.

Continuing on from last week, I shared with you a bit about my role as your Parish Priest (PP) or Pastor. Church law states that the Parish Priest "must be caring for the people and celebrating the sacraments; proclaiming the word of God through preaching and teaching; leading people in worship; leadership and serving the parish community; seeing to the administration of the parish goods; promoting mission outreach; and supporting and promoting social justice." In addition, a PP must, and I do pray for everyone constantly, in addition is to pray the *Missa Pro Populo* that is Mass for the people every Sunday and holy day of obligation. When you hear me say all our patron saint's names of our communities, you know I am praying the *Missa Pro Populo*.

Bishop Michael invites all parishioners of Boolaroo, Booragul, Morisset and Toronto to attend my Installation as Parish Priest. The Mass will be celebrated at St Joseph's Toronto, 140 Wangi Road Toronto on Wednesday 12th March 2025 at 6.00pm. Everyone is welcome.

As part of my appointment, the bishop has directed me to work towards one Pastoral Council (PC) and one Finance Committee (FC) to cover all the four parishes. This is to try and save me from being in meetings all the time and to allow me to be able to move around and have time for visitations and pastoral ministry. In the coming months, I will meet with the previous teams to listen, to seek advice on the membership of our future PC and FC and how it might look as we create and support communities where all will feel welcome, valued and safe. I believe in a synodal church where all of us must and will have an opportunity to have their say because as St Paul writes to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

There is much to look forward to as we begin our Ordinary Time in this year of the Jubilee of Hope and our time together in our parishes. Have a good week everyone.

Welcome

Welcome to all the visitors to our Parish of St john Vianney during the summer holiday season.

The Parish of St John Vianney Morisset, was officially formed in 1947, however our Mass center of St Patrick and St Brigid at Cooranbong, dates to the 1860's. The present Cooranbong Church celebrated its centenary in August 2006, and 150 years of Catholic presence in the area was celebrated in 2011.

It is documented that Saint Mary McKillop visited Cooranbong where she had a convent school. Up until 1966 St John Vianney Parish was part of the Diocese of Sydney, but now it is part of the Diocese of Maitland / Newcastle, with Bishop Michael Kennedy as Bishop.

The 9.30am Mass at Morisset is recorded each Sunday and uploaded to the Parish Website and Facebook later in the day, internet allowing. This allows people in nursing facilities and those away from the parish for whatever reason, to keep 'in touch' with the parish.

GOSPEL

John 2:1-11

The first of the signs given by Jesus was at Cana in Galilee.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
